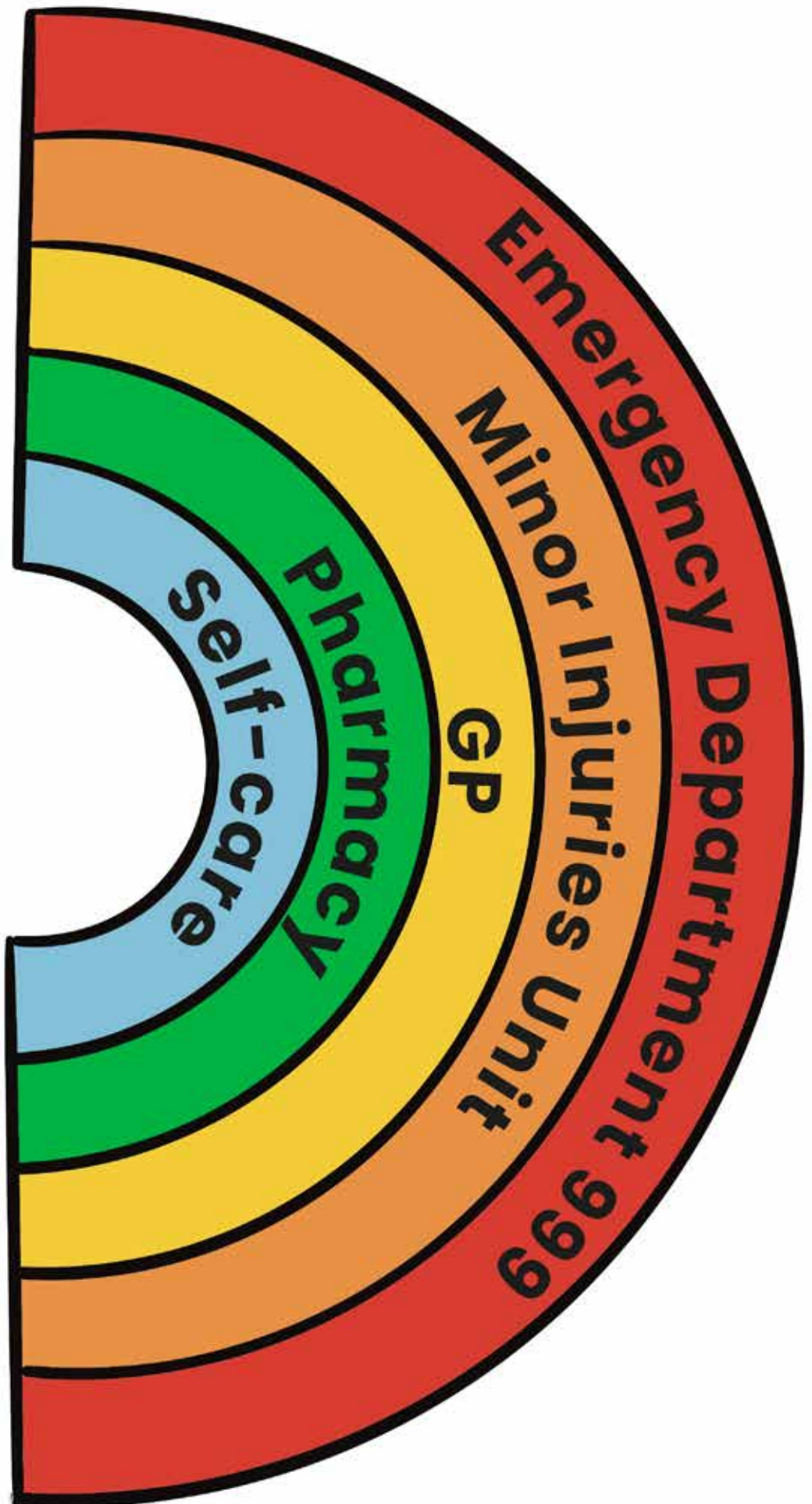

Sing the 'Pharmacy song' with the children, to the rhyme of "Miss Polly Had a Dolly".

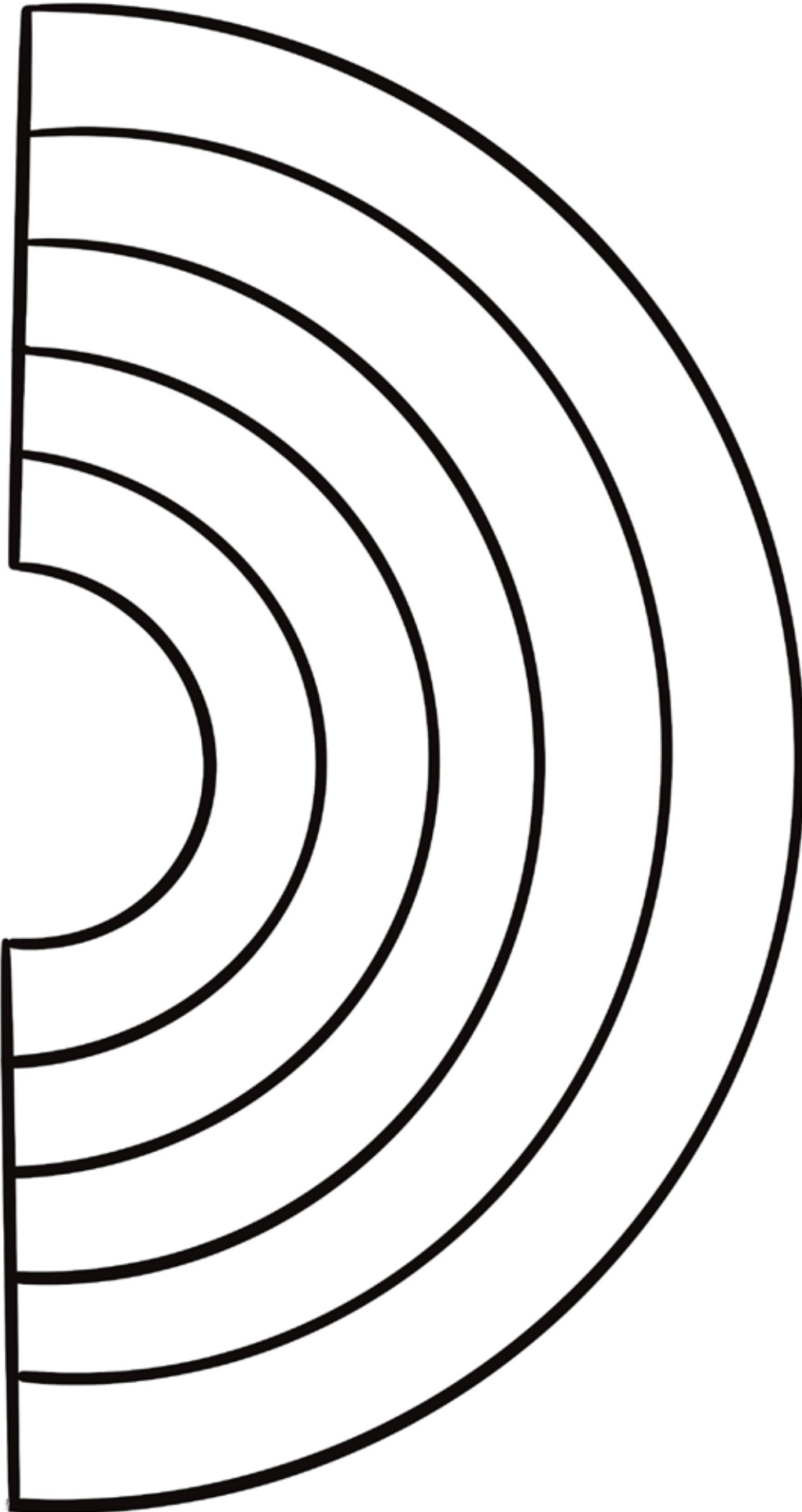
**Miss Polly had a dolly who was sick, sick, sick

Here's some medicine to make her better, yes, yes, yes!**

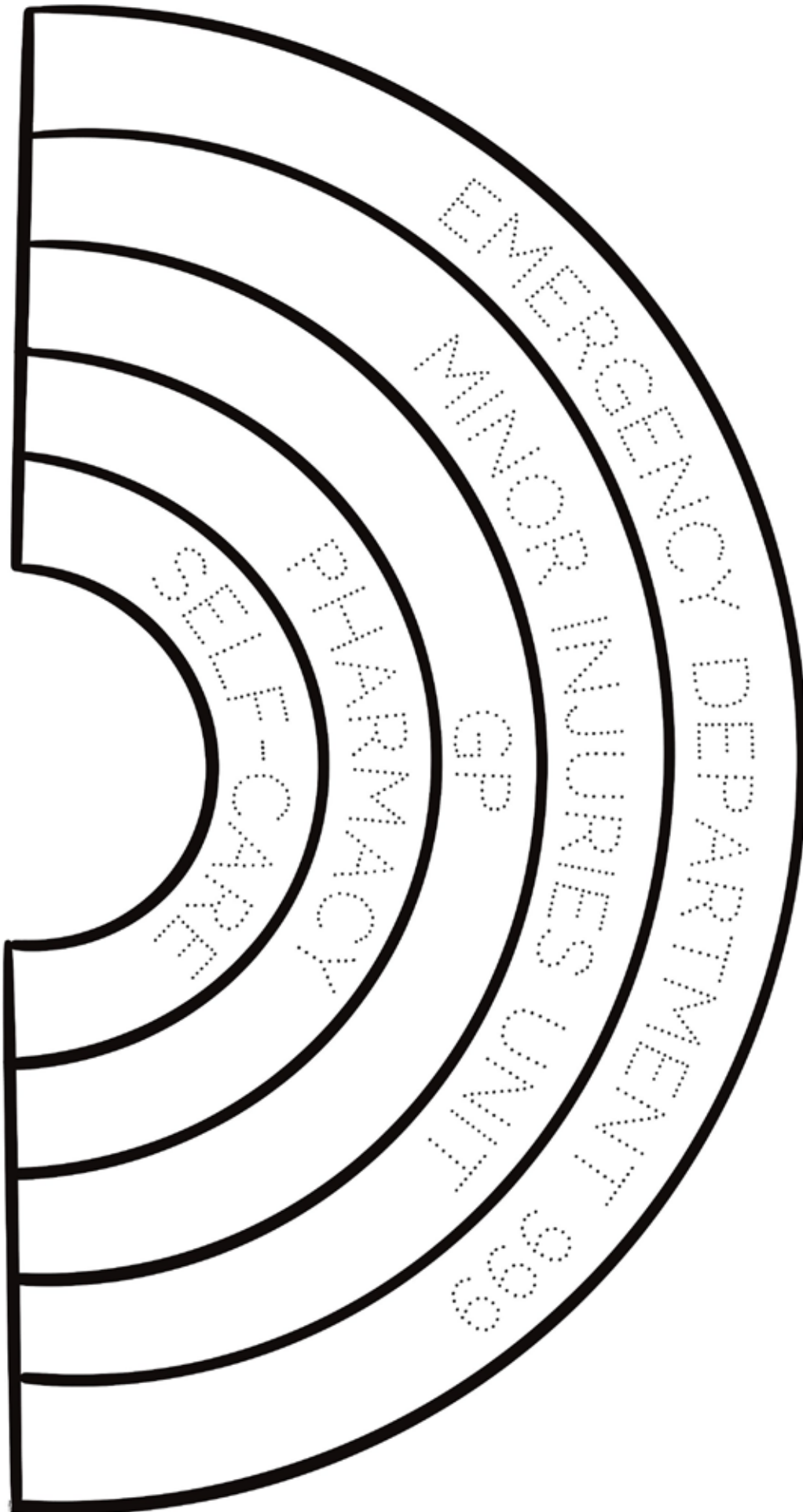

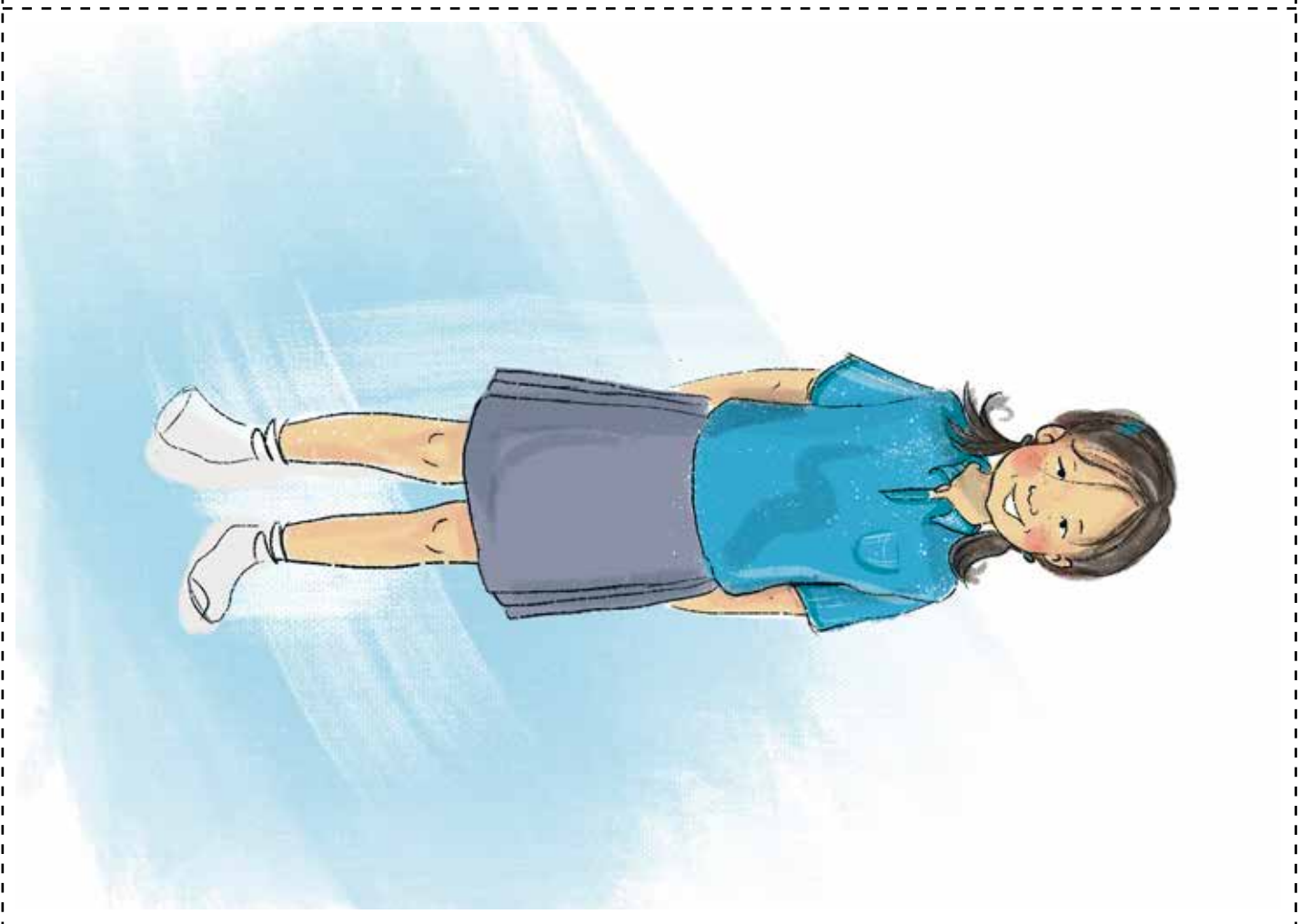
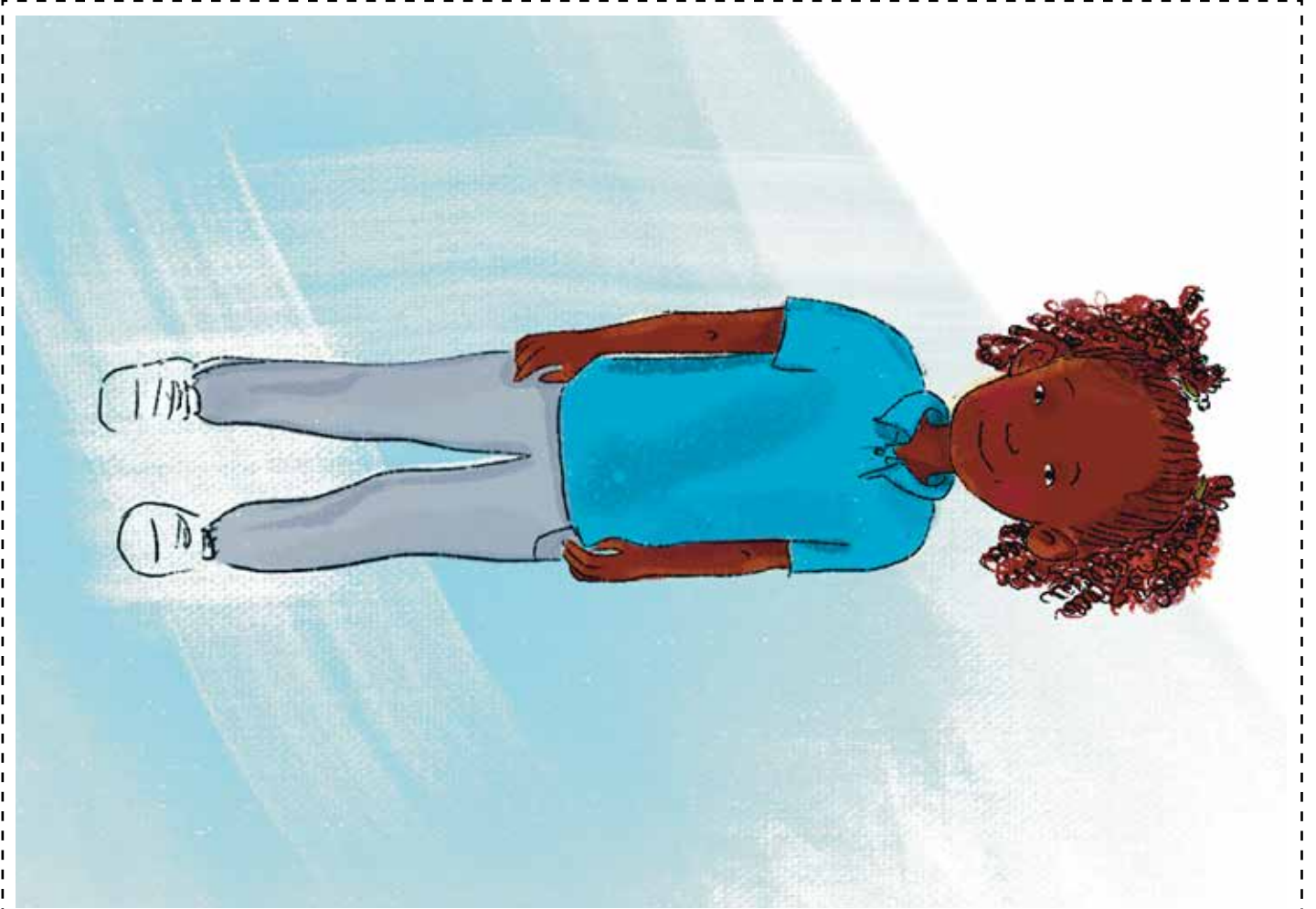


Colour in using the colours from Our Health Services Rainbow
